SCHOOL DESCRIPTION

Blanchet Catholic School is a private, independent Catholic school for youth in grades 6-12. Established in 1995, Blanchet provides a college preparatory curriculum for approximately 347 students annually. There are currently 51 seniors - 30 males and 21 females. Families of the students represent a wide range of socioeconomic backgrounds. Thirty-three percent are non-Caucasian. Thirty-seven percent of the student population receives internally funded need-based tuition assistance. The faculty includes 26 teachers and a counselor.

Blanchet students have a tradition of academic excellence. Since 1998, twenty-nine students have been recognized by the National Merit Scholarship organization (11 as finalists). One hundred percent of the 2016 graduates are now enrolled in college. Eighty-nine percent of recent graduates attend four-year universities, while the other eleven percent are currently attending a two-year community college. Blanchet is accredited by the Northwest Accreditation Commission, a division of AdvancEd, and is a member of the National Catholic Education Association.

MISSION STATEMENT

Blanchet Catholic School provides a comprehensive education program that enables students: to be challenged by an academically rigorous curriculum, to grow toward maturity in Christ, to contribute to the enrichment of society, and to participate in the traditions of the Catholic Church.

SCHOOL SCHEDULE

Blanchet is on a semester system with seven periods scheduled daily. The average class size is 20 students. The teacher/student ratio is 1:15.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Blanchet Catholic High School requires 24 credits for graduation (26 credits beginning with the Class of 2020), including four credits of religion and two credits in the same foreign language. Credit requirements are as follows: Religion (4), English (4), Math (3), Social Studies (4), Science (3), Foreign Language (2), Health (1), Applied Arts, Fine Arts (1), Physical Education (1) and Electives (1).

SERVICE PROGRAM

Blanchet students complete a minimum of twenty hours of community service annually. One half of their hours must be contributed to an agency that serves one of the following populations: at-risk youth, the elderly, and families living in poverty. During their senior year, students develop their own service project on a topic of personal interest. Students work with a faculty advisor and present an oral and written report.
