Blanchet Catholic School is very proud to present the class of 2014. These fifty-eight outstanding seniors received their diplomas during commencement ceremonies on June 7. The class was pleased to welcome former president Chuck Lee as their commencement speaker. Over the years, Mr. Lee has observed that this class in particular has bonded as a family, with most having attended Blanchet since the 7th grade.

The class of 2014 exceeded the previous school record set by the class of 2013 by earning \$7.8 million in scholarship offers. Graduates were accepted to 97 colleges and universities across the country including Baylor, Creighton, Johns Hopkins, Notre Dame, Santa Clara, Villanova and many more.

COLLEEN COEN maintained a 4.0 GPA while attending Blanchet and was a National Merit Finalist. She was active in numerous co-curricular activities including National Honor Society, where she served as chapter secretary, and DECA Club, where she qualified in three International Career Development Conference

events. Colleen was a member of Blanchet's Math Team, an Oregon Girls State Citizen, a state qualifier for mathematics and has been recognized as a Ronald Reagan Student Leader and as an OASSA Math Student of Merit. THOMPSON RECEIVES PRESTIGIOUS SCHOLARSHIP



Blanchet is pleased to announce that Connor Thompson, class of 2014, is the recipient of the A/101 Aviation Association Inc. Memorial College Scholarship in the amount of \$4,000. The A/101, nicknamed Comancheros, was a helicopter unit assigned to Special Forces in the Vietnam War. Their missions were classified for 30

years, and they are recognized as one of the most highly decorated aviation units in the Army. The A/101 Aviation Association provides an annual scholarship to a son, daughter, grandson, or granddaughter of current and former members of the A/101 Aviation Association. The scholarship is awarded to a student that is accepted to a four year university and meets the academic and community service criteria along with three letters of recommendation and a written essay about what it means to be a patriot. Connor wrote an essay titled, 'Why Serving One's Country Is Important." It is a moving tribute to those that serve our country, including his father who served as a Comanchero.

Connor will be attending Montana State University in the fall.

The Blanchet Catholic School community joined for its annual Founders Day celebration on February 27. The evening began with the National Honor Society induction ceremony honoring thirty-six outstanding Blanchet students. The National Honor Society (NHS) is the nation's premier organization recognizing outstanding high school students who demonstrate excellence in the areas of scholarship, leadership, service and character.

The Founders Day event also included recognition of Blanchet faculty, staff and board members.

Faculty and staff members Robin Smith, Steve Herb and Megan Johnston were honored for five years of service, and John Andreas, Sherrie Bashaw, Kasey Roberts and Filo Ortega were honored for fifteen years of service. Additionally, Blanchet Board of Directors member Garth Brandaw was honored for five years of service and Donna Garaventa for seventeen years of service.



The 2014 Community Partner of the Year Award was given to CB|Two Architects. Accepting the award was Matthew Stoffregen, principal Architect and Gretchen Stone, interior designer for CB|Two. CB|Two

JACOB & VICTOR



Class of 2014 graduate Jacob Myers has grown up on the race track. He first expressed an interest in racing at the age of 5 and, with the support of his entire extended family, was racing a full size car at Sunset Speedway by the time he turned 12. At the tender age of 13, he was racing Pure Stocks with his grandfather, Uncle Ron, Aunt Shawna and Uncle Steve...and winning first place. In 2011, Jacob was the Sunset Speedway track champion. He was just 15.

Last year was Jacob's first year in a Late Model Crate Motor car and he finished in 5th place overall, competing against 35 other adult drivers and driving the smallest of three allowed engine sizes. Jacob also took honors as Rookie of the Year, a coveted prize for anyone, let alone a 17 year old.

For Jacob, growing up at the track has meant more than just gaining in years. Through racing, Jacob has learned how to talk to hundreds of people in a crowd after winning a race, how to talk intelligently to fellow racers about set-ups for their race cars and ideas that can change their racing results, and he has learned how to shake a man's hand when he gets beat fair and square. Jacob has sponsors that contribute to his racing possibilities, and he never forgets to thank them personally. Above all, he has learned how to humbly include others in his racing experience. Jacob is not just a champion driver, he is a champion in the eyes of his race fans and, most importantly, the hero of one very special fan named Victor.

Victor is a 25 year old mentally challenged young man and an avid race fan. He lives in Beaverton with his adoptive parents Gary and Carol. Victor suffers from many debilitating health conditions that affect his quality and, ultimately, his length of life. Like many mentally handicapped individuals, Victor has had a difficult time fitting in and feeling like he was a part of something. In 2008 he accepted a job working as a ticket taker at Sunset Speedway's main gate. That's where he first met race car driver Jacob Myers, who made a point of taking the time to visit with Victor each time he arrived at the track. Victor was immediately Jacob's number one fan, and the two became fast friends.

Victor comes to the track every time Jacob races and can be heard cheering each and every time Jacob laps the track. This past year, Jacob asked Victor if he would like to be a member of his pit crew, a dream come true for Victor! He is now the official tire pressure checker and plays an important role in keeping Jacob's car running smoothly and Jacob racing safely. With his new job, Victor feels he is a part of something, a feeling he has been searching for for many years. Last December when Jacob took two trophies for his 2013 racing results, he gave one to Victor. Victor cherishes this trophy and keeps it on his headboard so he can see it every night before he goes to sleep.

Jacob has scaled back somewhat on his racing program this summer. He'll continue racing in the NW Extreme Dirt Late Model class in Banks, Lebanon and Cottage Grove this season, but will sit out several additional races as he prepares for his next endeavor – freshman year at Linfield College where he plans to study athletic training. He and Victor will keep in touch with continued weekly phone calls to discuss NASCAR results and with occasional visits. Most importantly, they'll still get to see each other at the track. Gary, Victor's dad, remarks, "Jacob is just an outstanding young man. He is compassionate and caring when most people his age are thinking mostly of themselves. He doesn't see that Victor has a disability and never treats him as if he does. We have truly enjoyed watching Jacob grow into the wonderful young man that he is today, and we are grateful that he has become and will always be an important part of Victor's life."





Last year, all of the drivers in the NW Extreme Late Model class decided to repaint their cars with a cartoon character theme. When his family asked Jacob what character he wanted to depict, he decided to let Victor choose. Victor made a fantastic and fitting choice, and the car was decked out as Captain America!

Caitlyn Connolly '04 ~ Caitlyn graduated from Santa Clara University in 2008 with a degree in history and minors in political science and urban education. She went on to complete a masters degree in education from the University of San Francisco in 2010. For the next two years, Caitlyn will

be teaching first grade at Shanghai Community International School in Shanghai, China.

Kimberly (Hopewell) Knackstedt '05 ~ In 2012 Kimberly graduated from the

University of Kansas with a Masters in Functional Special Education. She taught for two years in a special education resource room then moved to an urban elementary school in Kansas City. There she took over a program for students with emotional and behavioral disabilities working toward



supporting the students academically, behaviorally, and socially. By the end of Kimberly's time at the school, most of her students were spending 60-100% of their school day in the general education classroom with varied levels of support. She also served as the district trainer for crisis prevention and conducted a variety of professional development opportunities to support teachers in understanding emotional and behavioral disorders.

Kimberly left teaching after the 2012-2013 school year to begin a doctoral program at the University of Kansas. She was accepted into the program with 13 other individuals from around the world. KU is the #1 public special education graduate program in the United States and is said to be the top in the world. Her emphasis is on education policy and systems change (school reform). This summer she is teaching an undergraduate course, Introduction to Special Education, with two members of her cohort. She is also involved in supporting KU's transition of the masters programs online; specifically, helping develop and coordinate a new program for individuals to obtain certification in Special Education Administration. Kimberly lives in Kansas with her husband Joe of four years. Joe currently works for Key Bank on low income housing tax credits, and is working on his Masters in Urban Planning.

Katherine Dezsofi '09 ~ A double major in biology and anthropology at Western Oregon University, Katherine has been a field researcher in an ongoing project to discover the cause of declining populations of Rocky Mountain Trumpeter Swans. Like all sports, the participants balanced rigorous classes and homework with challenging swim practices. They navigated the busy holiday season, still dedicating time to improving their technique and building strength and speed in the water.

But the true beauty of the 2013-14 swim team lies in the athletes.

A handful of seniors stepped into the pool for the first time, facing the challenging journey of learning to be swimmers. That would have been enough, but they worked tirelessly to drop time and reach greater distances--and they did. Finishing a race wasn't enough for them; they persevered until they beat their best times over and over again.

Many members of the swim team gracefully balanced participation in the drama productions, music, DECA, and club swimming with their swim team commitments. The swim team parents travel great distances to watch their student's minute-long race, and they cheer just as loudly for the teammates.
