FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Blanchet Catholic School Community,

Blanchet concluded another successful school year with the graduation of the class of 2019 on June 8. This remarkable class of 48 seniors will go down as one of our school's most accomplished groups with achievements in academics, fine arts, and athletics.

The class earned more than \$5 million in scholarships and were accepted at more than 60 colleges and universities across the state, country, and world. Thirty-two of the 48 seniors earned at least one college scholarship. We are proud of our seniors and excited to see and enjoy their successes in the coming years.

During the final week of the school year, Blanchet 'broke ground' on the centerpiece of the Complete the Dream campaign, our new turf field and track. Construction kicked into high gear at the end of June with completion of the project scheduled for early October. Our goal is to host this year's Homecoming football game against Salem Academy at Blanchet on October 18.

Another big announcement at the end of this school year was the appointment of Mr. Robin Smith to the role as Principal for Blanchet Catholic School. A 2004 graduate of Blanchet, Robin's talent and enthusiasm for the school and our students will help him succeed as our school's educational leader. This move was accompanied by the shift in my assignment from President/Principal to a full time role as President of Blanchet Catholic School. The change will give me more opportunity to focus on fundraising and development for the school.

Blanchet is very excited about the upcoming 2019-2020 school year as it will be our 25th year of operation as a school. A number of activities and events are in the works to help us celebrate, including a pilgrimage to the gravesite of our namesake, Archbishop Frances Norbert Blanchet, in St. Paul on Monday, September 30, 2019. Throughout the year we will be providing opportunities for our alumni to return to Blanchet for tours and to take part in various anniversary activities.

I want to wish all of our families a restful and enjoyable summer and I look forward to the start of what I know will be a big year for Blanchet on Tuesday, September 3.

NIKHIL NAMBURI Valedictorian



Nikhil graduates as a National Merit Scholar Winner, U.S. Presidential Scholar semifinalist, and a member of the National Honor Society.

He is an active member of Blanchet's DECA program and served as the Oregon DECA state president during his junior and senior year. Nikhil is a six time DECA state champion and four year qualifier for DECA's International Conference. At the international

level he competed in Sports and Entertainment marketing and placed 6th as a freshman and received a 1st place international trophy as a senior.

Nikhil has been an active participant at the State Science Olympiad where he secured several State championships and medals. In addition to DECA and Science Olympiad, Nikhil actively participates in Student Council, Friends of Benedictine, Speech and Debate, and Leadership Youth of Salem. As a junior, Nikhil attended Oregon Boys State and was one of the 98 students in the country to be selected to participate in Boys Nation. Sam Hoskins '19

To say that Sam Hoskins is talented is an understatement. His passion for art goes deeper than the average high school student's. Sam loves art at the cellular level. Viewing his pieces will make that apparent to anyone who visits the many galleries and showcases he has been a part of over the past few years.

Sam came to Blanchet his freshman year looking for a school that would allow him the time and support to perfect his passion. The school understood the importance of Sam improving his God given gift of art and worked hand in hand with Sam and his family to give him the opportunity to chase his dream of becoming an artist.

This fall, Sam's dream will continue as he heads to Florence, Italy to attend the Florence Academy of Art (FAA). "What amazed me most about the Academy was the sheer level of skill that existed within the gates. Faculty, instructors, artists in residents, students, and guest lecturers all shared this profound drive for achievement beyond human limits," Sam said. "It is a surreal feeling to describe when traveling over 6,000 miles from everything I have ever known just to find a place that feels like home. It really shows that art is a universal language that has the ability to bridge time and cultural gaps.

"As I am in the countdown before I embark on this next chapter of my life when I return full time to the Academy, I have had plenty of time to reflect on where I have been and where I want to go. I am excited to return to such a fruitful environment and to really put in the time to refine my drawing, anatomical knowledge, and observation from life as a first year student. Many people have asked about all the things I plan on doing when I am in Florence. My response is sometimes shocking to some as I say, 'I will be drawing, drawing, and drawing.' Though Italy is a beautiful country and I will have my time for exploration, my primary purpose for attending the Academy is not to have instant gratification, but to work harder than I ever have before in order to achieve long term success.

"What do I want to do after the completion of my studies at FAA? Understandably, most people's concepts of career opportunities for artists are narrowed to either starving or being a teacher. Both of these options are not what I am after long term.

"The negative stigma regarding starving artists was fictitious ever since the time of Michaelanglo, who died having a net worth of over \$40 million in today's equivalence. At this point in my life, I want to stay committed to my ultimate goal, but stay flexible in my approach. Though I cannot say where my path will lead me after FAA, I can say where I want it to end up.

"Mythology, narratives, dramas, and images all express archetypal ideas before they can be grasped by language. It is through the artist who reaches into the unknown and brings back his discoveries, that new ideas are brought into the conscious realm. I believe that the least explored area of existence is not the bottom of the ocean or in deep space, but rather, in the reflective cavern of our own souls. When I look back at the end of my life, I hope to be best known as an explorer who traveled where few do in order to bring back the ideas of the collective unconscious. These philosophical concepts are almost always preexisting in the forms of creative interpretation before they can be confined to language. It is through realistic art that I feel that this goal can be most effectively realized."

My name is Karen Parton Lee. Most of of the current Blanchet Catholic School students know me as a Spanish teacher, but my Blanchet story is much longer than that. I had some wonderful teachers at St. Joe's and St. Vincent's, but once I got to sixth grade, I couldn't wait to go to middle school where we would get lockers, move from class to class with seven different teachers every day, and even get to choose some of the classes we could take. It was exciting!

Once I did get to Blanchet, I tried everything, Friends of Benedictine to Earth Club (now Outdoor Club). I loved playing sports and basketball was my favorite. I learned fundamentals from Coach Miller in eighth grade and how to play defense from Coach Wise. Now, maybe I'm not the tallest person you've ever seen, but I did play on a winning varsity basketball team coached by our very own Mr. Andreas. But I didn't stop there. I wanted to try other sports.

At first I was a little worried that I hadn't played volleyball before my freshman year or soccer before I was 17, but at a small school like Blanchet I was encouraged to join each team and my teammates and coaches, Coach of the Year Tina Pearson, and State Champion coach Sherri Bashaw, taught me how to kick a soccer ball, how to bump, set, hit, and I tried to block, but if you can't reach the top of the net, blocking is a little ineffective, but I was cheered on all the same. That's just what Blanchet is about. It's a place where as a student I felt I could follow my passions and explore new things.

I not only played sports, but I also loved being on stage during the many drama productions, led by Kasey Roberts, spending long hours and late nights in the theater rehearsing, singing, building sets, building friendships. The weeks leading up to the play I felt like I lived at the school (many of our students can relate), and I wouldn't have had it any other way.

After I graduated I went to the University of Portland where I studied Spanish and Education. I remember getting my first three page paper assignment and another two pager the same day. My roommate was worried, freaking out, and complaining. I felt like Blanchet had prepared me so well academically, I just whipped them out like it was nothing. I studied hard in college and had the opportunity to study a semester abroad in Spain, which was incredible. So, after graduation I moved to Spain and taught in a high school there for a year. "Blanchet is a place where as a student I felt I could follow my passions and explore new things."

After returning to the University of Portland to get my master's degree in teaching, I spent time moving around from school to school – I was a substitute teacher for all grades in Beaverton and Hillsboro, taught at an elementary school in Mexico, a middle school in Beaverton, two elementary schools in Salem, and then found myself on the phone with Mr. Guevara talking about coming back to Blanchet to teach. I thought about it, but it didn't take long for me to jump on the opportunity. I got to come back to a place where I basically had spent half my childhood with friends I loved and all these teachers who loved and cared about me. And those of you who have had my class know and can probably tell from my somewhat high energy level, that I LOVE being a teacher here at Blanchet. I get that energy from the people here. The students are amazing, the teachers work so hard and are so kind and dedicated. I couldn't think of a better place for me, and for baby Parton Lee to spend our time.

I look forward to prospective families' and students' visits to campus and hope they enjoy Blanchet as much as I do. Maybe one day they'll have a Blanchet story, too.
