- Amal Unbound by Aisha Saeed** 2018
In Pakistan, Amal holds onto her dream of being a teacher even after becoming an indentured servant to pay off her family's debt to the wealthy and corrupt Khan family.
Realistic Fiction 240 pages 600L AR 4.2 (6 Pts.)
- Amina' s Voice by Hena Khan** 2017
Amina, a Pakistani American Muslim girl, struggles to stay true to her family's culture while dealing with the vandalism of the local Islamic Center and mosque and her best friend Soojin's new friendship with their former nemesis.
Realistic Fiction 208 pages 800L AR 5.0 (5 Pts.)
- Ghost Boys by Jewell Parker Rhodes** 2018
After seventh-grader Jerome is shot by a white police officer, he observes the aftermath of his death and meets the ghosts of other fallen black boys including historical figure Emmett Till.
Magical Realism 214 pages 360L AR 3.0 (3 Pts.)
- Greenglass House by Kate Milford** 2014
At a smuggler's inn, 12-yr-old Milo, the innkeepers' adopted son, plans to spend his holidays relaxing, but soon guests arrive with strange stories about the house, sending Milo and his new friend on an adventure.
Fantasy Mystery 400 pages 800L AR 5.4 (15 Pts.)
- If I Ever Get Out of Here by Eric Gansworth** 2013
Seventh-grader Lewis "Shoe" Blake from the Tuscarora Reservation has a new friend, George Haddonfield, from the local air force base, but in 1975 upstate New York, there is a lot of tension and hatred between Native Americans and whites.
Historical Fiction 368 pages 870L AR 5.6 (16 Pts.)
- Mark of the Thief by Jennifer A. Nielsen** 2015
Nic, a slave in the mines of Rome, is forced to enter a sealed cave filled with Julius Caesar's treasures. What he finds will change his destiny and the history of the Empire.
Historical Fantasy 337 pages 740L AR 5.2 (12 Pts.)
- The Miscalculations of Lightning Girl by Stacy McAnulty** 2018
Math genius Lucy Callahan enrolls in middle school after years of homeschooling, and learns life is more than numbers.

Realistic Fiction 320 pages 530L AR 3.7 (7 Pts.)

Moving Target by Christina Díaz González 2015

Twelve-year-old Cassie Arroyo is a student in Rome, but her life changes when a secret organization, the Hastati, shoots her father. She learns she is a member of an ancient bloodline that enables her to use the Spear of Destiny.

New Kid by Jerry Craft 2019

Seventh grader Jordan Banks loves nothing more than drawing cartoons about his life, but instead of sending him to the art school of his dreams, his parents enroll him in a prestigious private school known for its academics.

The Next Great Paulie Fink by Ali Benjamin 2019

Led by new student Caitlyn, seventh-graders at a tiny rural school in Vermont create a reality-show inspired competition to determine who will replace the school's legendary class clown, Paulie Fink.

No Fixed Address by Susin Nielsen 2018

Refugee by Alan Gratz 2017

Josef is a Jewish boy living in 1930s Nazi Germany. Isabel is a Cuban girl in 1994. Mahmoud is a Syrian boy in 2015. All three kids go on harrowing journeys in search of refuge, and all face unimaginable dangers.

Sal and Gabi Break the Universe by Carlos Hernandez 2019

In order to heal after his mother's death, thirteen-year-old Sal learns to reach into time and space to retrieve things, and people, from other universes.

Skulduggery Pleasant by Derek Landy 2007
