### SCHOOL DESCRIPTION

Blanchet Catholic School is a private, independent Catholic school for Mid Valley youth in grades 6-12. The school was established in 1995 and provides a college preparatory curriculum for approximately 415 students annually. There are currently 59 seniors - 38 males and 21 females. Families of the students represent a wide range of socio-economic backgrounds. Fifty-two percent are non-Caucasian. Approximately fifty percent of the student population receives internally funded need-based tuition assistance.

The faculty is comprised of 28 teachers. All teachers hold at least a BA/BS degree, and seventy-two percent have at least one advanced degree.

Blanchet students have a tradition of academic excellence. Since 1998, thirty-four students have been recognized by the National Merit Scholarship organization (13 as finalists). 100 percent of our students graduated in 2024, and 66% of the Blanchet class of 2024 attend a four-year college or university. The school is accredited through the North Central Association Commission on Accreditation and School Improvement, and the Northwest Accreditation Commission, and the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Council on Accreditation and School Improvement, through Cognia.

### MISSION STATEMENT

Blanchet Catholic School provides a comprehensive education program that enables students: to be challenged by an academically rigorous curriculum; to grow toward maturity in Christ; to contribute to the enrichment of society; and to participate in the traditions of the Catholic Church.

### SCHOOL SCHEDULE

Blanchet is on a semester system with seven periods scheduled daily. The average class size is 20 students. The teacher/student ratio is 1:12.

## SERVICE PROGRAM

Blanchet students complete a minimum of ten hours of community service annually during each year of high school. One half of their hours per year must be contributed to an agency that serves one of the following populations: at risk youth, the elderly and families living in poverty. During their senior year, students develop their own service project on a topic of personal interest. Students work with a faculty advisor and present an oral and written report.
