Honors, Advanced Placement (AP), & Dual Credit (CCN - College Credit Now)

Our Honors, AP and CCN courses allow students the opportunity to take the most rigorous courses available at Blanchet in preparation for collegiate studies. These courses are available to all of our high school students.

Blanchet partners with the Oregon Institute of Technology and Chemeketa Community College to offer courses taught at Blanchet by teachers certified with a Masters or higher degree in each subject area. Credits earned from these courses will transfer to most 4-year colleges and universities.



Advanced Placement (AP)

The AP curriculum, administered by The College Board, consists of standardized high school courses that are roughly equivalent to undergraduate college courses. After completing an AP class, students have the opportunity to take the AP exam in that subject, which can earn them credits and accelerated placement in college.

Honors, Advanced Placement, **Dual Credit Course Eligibility**

To be eligible for an honors class, a student should have: At least a B average in the subject of the honors course. Students who meet the grade requirement in the subject will be invited to register for the class. Any students who do not meet the grade requirement but are still interested in registering for the class must speak with the teacher of the honors class for permission. Students may be asked to take a placement test to determine ability and chances for success in the program. Administration, in consultation with the teacher of the class, will make final decisions on student enrollment in accelerated courses.
