SCHOOL DESCRIPTION

Blanchet Catholic School is a private, independent Catholic school for Mid Valley youth in grades 6-12. The school was established in 1995 and provides a college preparatory curriculum for approximately 450 students annually. There are currently 43 seniors - 20 males and 23 females. The families of Blanchet students represent a wide range of socioeconomic backgrounds. Fifty-two percent are non-Caucasian. Approximately 50% of the student population receives internally funded, need-based tuition assistance.

The faculty consists of 34 teachers. All teachers hold at least a BA/BS degree, and seventy-nine percent have at least one advanced degree.

Blanchet students have a tradition of academic excellence. Since 1998, thirty-six students have been recognized by the National Merit Scholarship organization (14 as finalists). 100 percent of our students graduated in 2025, and 71% of the Blanchet class of 2025 will attend a four-year college or university. The school is accredited by the Northwest Accreditation Commission, a division of AdvancEd, and is a member of the National Catholic Education Association.

MISSION STATEMENT

Blanchet Catholic School provides a comprehensive education program that enables students to be challenged by an academically rigorous curriculum; to grow toward maturity in Christ; to contribute to the enrichment of society; and to participate in the traditions of the Catholic Church.

SCHOOL SCHEDULE

Blanchet is on a semester system with seven periods scheduled daily. The average class size is 16 students. The teacher/student ratio is 1:12.
