

All students must be in compliance with the Blanchet dress code
at the 6th grade Orientation on August 21 and
Returning Student Schedule Pick up + New Student Orientation (grades 7-12) on August 27.

- Boys must wear collared shirts. Girls can wear a collared shirt or blouse. Students may not wear t-shirts or otherwise inappropriate tops. The shirts may be any color or pattern.
- Neckline must be no lower than 2 inches from the top of the collarbone.
- Pants must be clean, hemmed, fitted and worn on the hips. Excessively long, excessively loose or excessively tight pants are not acceptable.
- Denim pants, shorts or skirts are not acceptable. Athletic shorts and sweats are also not acceptable.
- Shorts must be worn with the bottom of the hem no more than 3 inches above the knee.
- Skirts must be worn with the bottom of the hem no higher than the top of the knee. This includes the top of slits on skirts.
- Only girls may wear earrings. No other visible piercing is allowed.
- Hair must be clean, neatly combed and of a natural color. Hair for boys must not extend below the collar and sideburns must not extend below the earlobe.
- No open-toed or backless shoes. High heels can be no taller than three inches.





CARPOOLS



Blanchet does not coordinate or formulate carpools between members of our community. Parents are welcome to access their <u>Facts Family Portal</u> accounts and click on the School area, where you will find the Directory. You may sort the list by zip code to find other Blanchet families who have shared their contact information if you wish to organize/coordinate your own carpools.

The Blanchet directory, and all of the personal information in it, is solely for personal use by families of current students of the school. It is not to be shared with other individuals, organizations, or businesses.

We encourage families to connect and coordinate rides to and from campus through the use of the directory. By enabling families to use the directory for that purpose, however, Blanchet in no way assumes any responsibility related to anyone's carpool arrangements. 

DROP OFF & PICK UP

Blanchet has two entrances onto campus—Market Street entrance (front entrance) and Sunnyview Road entrance (back entrance). Traffic flow on campus can get congested at times, especially in the front of the building. A couple of ways to help alleviate this problem is to:

- Use the Front and Back Pick Up areas to help alleviate the congestion at the Market St entrance.
- Pull all the way up to the curbside as close to the car in front of you.
- Have your student(s) ready to exit your vehicle.
- Market Street entrance: Pull all the way forward until they are even with the white cross when using the Front Drop
 Off / Pick Up area
- Sunnyview Rd. entrance: Students can enter through any of the Mid High Commons doors using their ID cards at the Back Drop Off / Pick Up area.
- It is recommended that lining up in either Pick Up areas start no earlier than 3:00 p.m.
- Pick up is not allowed between 2:45 p.m. and 3:10 p.m.

In addition, please make sure to drive slowly while on campus. We have students all over the campus coming and going from various activities, practices and games. We greatly appreciate your help in this matter.



PROTOCOLS

As we head back to school this Fall, we want all parents and students to be informed about the safety protocols. At Blanchet, student and staff safety is of the utmost importance, and we want you to know the safety and security measures and practices that are in place and that will be carried out daily.

Our administrative team and board members routinely discuss security expectations related to the security of all outside entrance doors and heightened alertness at the front entrance doors, where students, staff, visitors, and the public enter. Security cameras are routinely monitored at the front entrance, exterior of the school, and throughout the school building. Additionally, the school engages in emergency drills for fire drills, shelter-in-place drills, evacuations, and lockdown procedures throughout the school year.

- All faculty and staff are required to wear their appropriate photo identification at all times.
- All parents, guests, and visitors will be asked to come to the front doors and ring the buzzer on the right side of the entrance. Once you are buzzed in, you must check in at reception and be issued a visitor's pass. The pass must be returned when you leave the building.
- If a guest has an appointment with a faculty, staff, or administrator, you should check in and wait for that person to meet you in the front lobby.
- We are also updating our security measures for students. Please review these with your children so they know the new rules. We will also review them once school is back in session.

We want everyone to understand that our security measures protect the safety of our students, staff, and school buildings. We appreciate your patience and understanding as we work together to ensure the safety of our students and staff.

STUDENTS' SAFETY RESPONSIBILITIES

CAMPUS SAFETY

Students will be instructed not to allow anyone into the building through any back for side doors.

All parents, guests, and visitors must enter through the front entrance and check in.



BUILDING ENTRANCE

Students must use their identification badge to get around the building, including the front door, mid high entrance, and science building entrances.



MEAL TIME

Students must have their identification badge to pick up their ordered lunches or snacks. Students without badges must go to the back of the line until all students with badges have been served.



LOST ID BADGES

If a student identification badge is lost or stolen, students must report this to the main office so that the badge can be deactivated and a new one issued. If students lose their security badge, they can get a new one at the main office.



Theme Basket Ideas

- Tea Time. Curate an assortment of bagged and loose leaf teas in a variety of flavors, such as black, green, white, and herbal. Include accessories as well, such as a teapot or kettle, tea steeper, honey, and a tea towel.
- Coffee Lovers. Put together a variety of whole and ground coffee beans in different roasts and flavors, along with mugs and sweet treats.
- Chocolate Celebration. Fill a basket with gourmet chocolates, hot
 cocoa supplies, and chocolate-covered snacks like fruit, nuts,
 pretzels, and espresso beans. To add an activity to the basket,
 consider including a chocolate fondue set or tickets to a chocolatetasting event.
- Wine and Cheese. Include bottles of quality red and white wine, an
 assortment of cheeses, crackers, and other charcuterie-board
 supplies. You could even increase the basket's value by including a
 vineyard tour with the package.


