FROM THE PRESIDENT



Dear Blanchet Catholic Community,

Even after 40 years in education, I am always amazed how busy schools are during the spring season. This spring is no exception. At Blanchet we have enjoyed celebrating

the success of our spring varsity athletic teams – all of whom competed in post-season play. We have honored student achievement at various award ceremonies and recognition events, and are looking forward to graduating 65 excellent seniors on June 11. The class of 2011 has been offered an amazing \$3.2 million in scholarship awards!

We are completing the first year of our Strategic Five-Year Plan, Vision 2015. We have had a very successful 16th school year, and goals that have been achieved include replacing the bleachers in the main gym, significantly enhancing our website and purchasing laptops for all of our teachers. This summer we will complete an additional \$100,000 worth of facility renovations including remodeling a pair of mid high restrooms, replacing exterior doors, upgrading the computer lab, repairing asphalt in our parking lot and completing campus safety/ beautification projects. 

Emily is also a member of the Spirituality Team and National Honor Society. school for its academics and to Minnesota for the snow. Emily's mom Darcy Smith says, "Emily visited the college and knew it was the place for her." Darcy grew up in Duluth, Minnesota and says Emily has inherited her love of cold and snow.

Health Sciences University to become an orthopedic surgeon.




Tevin Sterling Gianella


Mr. Brooks


MR. HAGGERTY



The Blanchet Experience

Service is an integral part of our school mission and student experience at Blanchet Catholic. Students contribute a minimum of twenty hours of service annually and are also responsible for turning in a service log and reflection paper for each year they attend Blanchet.

In addition to the student service requirement, many Blanchet teachers incorporate service into the classroom experience. A few examples include Mrs. Bashaw leading the mid high students in a clean-up of Camp Howard; Ms. Pavelek organizing a day long service project for the sophomore class that benefitted the elderly in Mt. Angel; and

Mrs. Wise coordinating a project where her eighth grade students wrote letters and sent necessities to soldiers overseas as well as conducted a "bottles for babies" drive for St. Germaine's.

"The most significant experience that I had about my service project this year was when I helped Bruce Bigland. The task of washing Bruce's windows was a simple task, but a turning point in my life of service. The reason for this was that when I had finished up washing all the windows, Bruce

gave me something to drink and sat me down to have a conversation about society with him. He explained how service is a great way to give back to the community and that teenagers today seem as if they don't get that. When these words came out of Bruce's mouth, they seemingly flashed through my brain and found a spot to rest. As I left Bruce's house, I thought to myself and realized I should be one of the 'different' teenagers in today's society. The type of new-era teenager that doesn't get labeled as always doing bad things, but instead a good young person who serves their community."



SKID is a graphic and realistic portrayal of crushed vehicles and injured bodies. As the scenario unfolded, local police, fire and rescue, Life Flight and other public safety partners converged on the scene.

President Charles Lee commented, "This assembly took place just a few days before Blanchet's annual prom. Our students are very responsible, but our duty is to provide as much education about safe behavior as possible. Our hope is that this emotional assembly will remind students of the dangers of drinking and driving and the consequences of their actions."

Karrie Hagedorn '04 was a stand out soccer player at Blanchet Catholic and has continued her athletic pursuits, especially long distance running. Karrie completed the Boston Marathon this spring, finishing with a personal best time – 3:05.

After graduating from Blanchet, Hagedorn attended Saint Mary's College of California where she majored in politics and minored in both Spanish and communication. She earned a spot on the Dean's List every semester and won the Thomas Jefferson Award for graduating at the top of her class in the politics department. While at Saint Mary's, Hagedorn ran cross country for the Gaels (a Division 1 athletic program). She broke the school record in the women's 6K and was named to the All Conference Honorable Mention Team during her senior year and the West Coast Conference All-Academic Team in 2006, 2007 and 2008. She also served as team captain during her junior and senior years, competed in the NCAA Division 1 Western Regionals in 2006, 2007 and 2008, and won various Saint Mary's College Athlete of the Week awards.

After college, Hagedorn missed athletic competition and decided to continue her cross country training. She has now run the Nike Women's Marathon twice. She finished in 6th place out of a field of 5,000 in the 2010 Nike Women's Marathon.

In addition to athletic success, Hagedorn has a rewarding profession. She is a Fundraising Coordinator for the Muscular Dystrophy Association (MDA). Hagedorn reports that she helps "raise funds for local families affected by any of the 43 muscular dystrophy diseases, such as ALS or Lou Gehrig's and Duchene's Muscular Dystrophy. The MDA funds clinical research, multiple disciplinary clinics, support groups, wheelchair and other medical device repairs and a week-long summer camp for children ages 7-17. My Greater San Francisco Bay Area office (located in Concord, CA) finished 2010 as the number one fundraising office in the nation for MDA!"

Hagedorn treasures her experiences at Blanchet Catholic. Her favorite memory was playing in the State championship game in girl's soccer. Hagedorn states, "Kristin Mazzei's game winning goal against Marist to put us into the Championship will be forever etched in my memory." She also fondly recalls her classes with Mr. Brooks who prepared her well for college and "challenged me to think critically and in a capacity beyond the typical high school classroom setting."

Beyond the academic preparation, Hagedorn is appreciative of Blanchet's emphasis on values, faith and service. She says, "At Blanchet, students do not just receive an extraordinary academic experience, but also grow into adulthood in an environment focused on giving back to the community and fighting for what is just."
