### FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Blanchet Catholic School Community,

The 2020-2021 school year at Blanchet has truly been unlike any other in our 26-year history as our entire school community has been forced to make adjustments and sacrifices brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic.

When the pandemic began last spring, Blanchet's team was able to quickly transition our school into a digital learning environment that helped our students finish out the 2019-2020 school year in the best possible manner. Throughout the summer, our administration and board worked to create multiple learning plans for the 2020-2021 school year so that we would be ready to take on whatever scenarios we encountered.

When school began in September, our teachers led our students through a full digital program that allowed students to take a full load of classes, including honors, AP, and electives, in our Blue/Gray day block schedule. Students took classes Monday through Thursday from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. each week. In addition, we were able to offer a wide assortment of clubs, athletic workouts, tutoring sessions, and other in-person activities that helped our students stay connected to their friends, teachers, coaches, and community.

On January 25, Blanchet welcomed back our students to campus with the introduction of our hybrid learning plan. This plan allows middle school students on campus each Monday and Tuesday and high school students on campus on Wednesdays and Thursdays.

It has been wonderful to have the students back on campus. The energy level they bring to the hallways and classrooms is terrific. Currently, almost 90% of our students are attending classes in person, with the other continuing to attend classes through Zoom each day.

While this year has definitely been challenging, it has also put a spotlight on one of the keys to Blanchet's success both this year and throughout our history - the people of our community.

None of the adjustments or transitions that we have made since March of 2020 would have been possible without a faculty and staff that was dedicated to providing the best educational experience possible at Blanchet. Our teachers pivoted last spring to offer digital learning and this summer adopted Google Classroom and Zoom as their main teaching tools for the first time. Along the way, they have also made the change to teaching on a block schedule with 75-minute classes instead of our traditional 45-minute periods.

While nobody knows exactly what challenges we will continue to face here at Blanchet, the confidence in our staff to bond together and do what is necessary to make our programs work and help our students succeed makes me confident that we can and will continue to thrive By Courage & Faith.

What was supposed to be a two week reprieve from classes with a return to school after spring break turned into months and now a year with school doors closed to students. While other schools stopped instruction, Blanchet Catholic School began its digital learning protocol immediately, allowing students to continue their education through an online program. Blanchet's teachers quickly adapted their teaching methods and continued to offer students what was promised to them in the school's mission: an education that enables students to be challenged by an academically rigorous curriculum, grow toward maturity in Christ, contribute to the enrichment of society, and participate in the traditions of the Catholic Church.

It took a lot of planning, communication and creativity to finish out the school

community as a whole came together to keep the family aspect of Blanchet alive and well even when social distancing kept them physically apart.

Cavalier faculty and staff came together to rise to the challenge. They wholeheartedly moved forward, creating ways to stay connected with studentes and families. Traditions like Spirit Week, Tuesday Time, and Class Day were converted to a digital format. Visits to students homes to deliver yard signs, letters of appreciation, and awards became the norm. Mrs. Bashaw even surprised all of her students when she delivered Easter eggs with notes of encouragement and sweets on their doorsteps. The

Mrs. Heintzman opened her art room to students looking for an outlet for their passion in visual arts. Mr. Mucken offered weight training opportunities to students in his new weightroom. The Wiegand Arts Center buzzed with the sound of students working in small cohorts to rehearse and present not one but two productions over the past few months. With more and more students looking for ways to be involved outside of the digital classroom, clubs, study tables, and tutoring were offered.

With the direction of epidemeologists, the Oregon Health Authority and following the Center for Disease Control's







regulations. the board of directors created a return to in-person learning plan and voted to open Blanchet's campus once again to students in a hybrid learning model.

Starting with the new semester on January 25, 2021, students joined socially distanced classrooms two days a week and digital classrooms two days a week on a block schedule. Mid high students were welcomed on campus on Mondays and Tuesdays while high school students attended classes digitally. On Wednesdays and Thursdays, high school students filled Blanchet classrooms while mid high students joined Zoom classrooms online. The transition from fulltime digital learning to hybrid learning was quickly executed, and once again the Blanchet teachers adapted to the changes.

Blanchet's principal Robin Smith said, "I am so proud of the work our faculty and staff have done. It's their efforts that have made it possible for us to consistently deliver quality education to our students both digitally and now back inperson. The energy the students bring to the building just reminds us all why we got into education."

After seven successful weeks of hybrid in-person learning, the board once again voted to open campus to all Cavalier students and return to in-person learning four days a week. Students who chose to stay home were offered the ability to continue digitally until the end of the school year. All Blanchet classrooms were outfitted with recording devices to allow teachers to teach to students in their classrooms and to those learning from home. On March 15, 2021, the doors of Blanchet were opened to both high school and middle school students who filled classrooms on campus at the same time.

"We have been working to get our students more in-person opportunities since this entire pandemic began and it was exciting to see so many students here on March 15," Blanchet president Bob Weber said. "The energy level in the building has increased and we are so happy to have our students back on campus."

As the school year is quickly coming to an end, the administrators, faculty and staff continue to adapt teaching styles, classroom experiences, and co-curricular activities to allow students and families the chance to enjoy all that Blanchet has to offer. Though COVID-19 has changed how the school operates, it has not changed the vision or mission of Blanchet.

"The school's motto, 'By Courage & Faith,' resonates in all that we do at Blanchet Catholic, as we provide the best Catholic, college-prep education possible to students," said Bob Weber. He continued, "We remain committed to what makes Blanchet so special, our families. The Cavaliers have come together to support one another and continue to be one school, one family."

# THE RAFFENSPERGERS

The Raffensperger family has been a part of the Blanchet Catholic School community for over 17 years. Parke and Corrie Raffensperger are parents to three Cavalier graduates, Drew '09, Lindsay '11 and Matt '20, and two current Blanchet students, Bridget '22, and Claire '24. When asked why they chose Blanchet Catholic School for their children, they answered, "We wanted our children to not only have the opportunity to have a learning situation which focused on college prep, but also emphasized the principles of Christian and Catholic faith. Blanchet met those goals."

Parke and Corrie have been active parents in the

community and their children followed suit as members of sports teams, DECA club, Outdoor Club, Spirituality Team, and theater productions to name a few. Blanchet Catholic School is always excited to welcome new teachers to campus, but when the new teacher is a Cavalier graduate, it is even more exciting. Shea White-Toney ('14) joins our staff as a mid high English and Drama teacher. He also joins the Cavalier basketball program as a coach.

While a student at Blanchet, Shea was involved in baseball, basketball, drama and DECA. When asked what his favorite memory of Blanchet is, he answered, "Going to DECA Nationals in Anaheim my junior year. I had so much fun going to Disneyland and spending time with my friends."

After graduating from Blanchet, Shea attended the University of Portland where he earned a Bachelor's of Marketing degree in 2018. Once he completed his stint as at the University of Portland, he was approached by a company to teach English as a second language to students at Luhe Public High School in China. ### DIACK ECOLOGY GRANT ALLOWS FOR EXPLORATION AT HOME

Blanchet science teacher Dr. Micki Halsey Randall knew that she needed to find a creative solution for keeping students engaged in the midst of digital learning. With all the screen time required in a distance learning environment, she wanted to give her students a breath of fresh air--literally!

"When we decided to go back digitally, I thought, 'Oh my gosh, how do I get kids engaged outside, because I don't want them staring at a screen the whole time?" Dr. HR explained. "Even the idea of them coming back but being socially distanced--how do we do microscope work if they can't share a microscope?"

The solution? Take-home science kits with portable equipment to help students conduct observations in their own backyards. Dr. HR turned to Mike Weddle at Diack Ecology for help funding the large undertaking. The Diack Ecology Education Program provides grants and resources for teachers and students in Oregon to encourage field-based science and ecology studies. Through her work with the Outdoor Learning Environment (OLE), Dr. HR had already received several grants from the nonprofit.



"This is a company that loves to get kids outside," she said. "With my Outdoor Learning Environment, it was this natural marriage between what I needed and who they wanted to give money to."

The take-home kits were delivered to all of Dr. HR's eighth graders in Integrated Science 8 and freshmen/sophomores in Biology--about 100 students in total. Mid high students received handheld lenses to identify specimens of rocks, soils, insects, and plants. As a class, they will be creating a map of their locations and comparing/contrasting the items discovered in their backyards.

High school Biology students received handheld microscopes

instead of lenses, which they are using to explore habitat characteristics, looking closely at insects and plants. The information they gather will be used to design a plan for improving the habitat of the OLE once on-campus learning resumes. All kits included a journal, colored pencils, whiteboard, and markers.



"I'm a big fan of whiteboards," Dr. HR said. "There's new research that says kids are more likely to engage on a whiteboard than they are on pencil/paper because it's so easy to erase if they make a mistake. There's no permanent record, so they're more willing to take those risks to try to answer things and brainstorm."

We're proud to have a dedicated, creative teacher like Dr. HR as part of our Blanchet family, and look forward to seeing all the wonderful observations and discoveries that stem from our students' outdoor learning experiences!

Everyone's collaboration is important- doctors, nurses, respiratory therapists, pharmacists, physical therapists, social workers, CNA's, housekeepers, and all other hospital staff are essential for a patient's hospital stay. The biggest lesson I have learned, though, is to check in on your loved ones. This is such a trying time for so many - lost jobs, lost family, lost time with each other. Take care of your people, help them as you

### **OUR NAMESAKE**

Blanchet Catholic School was named in honor of the first Archbishop of the Oregon Territory, Archbishop Francis Norbert Blanchet. During his long tenure with the Church, Archbishop Blanchet ministered to cholera victims, helped build a strong archdiocese in the midst of wilderness and established twenty-three churches, nine schools, a college and an orphanage. His pioneering spirit serves as an excellent example to Blanchet students.

Archbishop Blanchet is buried in a cemetery in St. Paul, Oregon. A replica of the cross that marks his gravesite now stands outside the main entrance of Blanchet

to remind our community of his contributions.

### THE BLANCHET CATHOLIC SCHOOL **ADVANTAGE**

Since our school's founding in 1995. Blanchet has made every reasonable effort to ensure that no qualified student is denied a Blanchet education due to financial limitations. This policy was adopted by the Board of Directors and remains one of Blanchet's most important guiding principles.

Funding this philosophy of inclusiveness is our most significant challenge in operating our successful college preparatory school. The need for financial assistance increases annually. Each school year, over \$350,000 is distributed to qualifying families. Fifty-two percent of our parents receive financial assistance towards tuition costs.

Blanchet's Legacy Founders, Jim and Jane Kreitzberg, made an eight-year commitment towards assisting motivated students who otherwise would be unable to attend Blanchet. Their incredible multi-million dollar pledge expired in the 2005-2006 school year. The generosity of Jim and Jane Kreitzberg ensured that hundreds of deserving students received the assistance they needed to attend Blanchet during its first decade of operation. The members of the Archbishop Blanchet Society now carry on that tradition.

Did you know that the actual cost of a Blanchet education is over \$12,000 per student, although we only charge parents \$8,425 (mid high) and \$9,725 (high school)? Our Board is committed to keeping tuition affordable for MidValley families. However, this poses a significant fundraising challenge.

Blanchet must annually fundraise in order to make up the difference between the amount of tuition charged and the actual cost of education.

The Archbishop Blanchet Society is a giving society whose members contribute a minimum of \$1,000 annually for at least five years. Our current members' gifts help support our operating budget and allow us to provide tuition assistance to qualifying families. Over \$500,000 is distributed annually to families who otherwise would not be able to send their children to Blanchet.

> Blanchet is the only Catholic secondary school in Salem, Oregon. As a private, non-profit organization, Blanchet has never received financial support from an archdiocese, parish or religious order. The Archbishop Blanchet Society was established as a means to bridge the gap between the amount of tuition charged and the true cost of educating a Blanchet student.
