During his 16 years at Blanchet, Chuck led the effort to raise over \$17 million to purchase and renovate the facility and provide millions of dollars in financial aid. In 2013, Chuck was hired by Mountain West to help create Career Technical Education Center in Salem.

Together, he and his wife Krina have six children and eleven grandchildren. Mr. Lee was elected to the Keizer City Council in 2001 and 2005, served three terms on the Salem/Keizer School Board and was also appointed by the Governor to the State Ethics Commission. Chuck received the National Catholic Education Award in 2009.

Q: What areas of your work do you most enjoy or drives you to succeed?

A: I'm driven to succeed by people – those I'm honored to work for and people we are working to serve. Disability policy is not easy - disabled Americans have been through a lot, especially the past year. I hear countless stories of people and families who need support, equal access, or have been discriminated against. I'm driven to do better knowing we can help and do something to meet their needs. Plus, I've been really lucky in each of my positions from the Hill to now to work for bosses who believe in the work they do and deeply care.

Q: What work-related achievement are you most proud of?

A: The work I've done is about serving the public and the



boss I work for, not about achievements or credit for myself. It is hard to pinpoint something specific. In 2018, I was selected as the Gold Star award recipient from the Association of University Centers on Disability. "Established in 2002, the AUCD Gold Star Award is presented to a Capitol Hill staffer who exemplifies a true partnership in crafting strong public policy. This award recognizes the staffer for his/ her professional and personal efforts to craft policy and implement programs with input from AUCD and the greater disability community, thus supporting AUCD in achieving its mission to advance policy and practice for and with people living with developmental and other disabilities, their families, and communities." It was an honor to receive that award and be recognized for collaboration and partnership with the disability community in crafting legislation.

Q: How do you cope with work pressures and managing a healthy work-life balance? How do you unwind?

A: As expected, my job has long hours and we are rarely "offline." It is so important to find time for myself and my husband, Joe, and separate from my computer, even if only for an hour or two. I still ride horses, just as I did while at Blanchet. I can't take my phone with me while riding so it is a great way to unplug. It sounds cliché, but we also have a Peloton. It is always nice to ride with friends. Getting exercise has been the best way to feel re-energized.

Q: Where do you think/hope you will be, career and/or personally, in 5 years' time?



A: Looking forward five years is difficult as my current position did not exist a year ago. I really didn't expect to be where I am today! It is hard to imagine where I could be in five years. I've learned to become a person who embraces opportunities when they are presented and embrace change. I hope in five years I am still fighting for access, equity, and inclusion, but maybe at a different pace with slightly shorter work days. Personally, I want to continue enjoying the life Joe and I have together with our cat, Taz, and spend time traveling. I enjoy riding and competing my horse and hope to continue doing so with the amazing barn family I've built in DC.

O: What is your fondest memory of Blanchet?
