FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Blanchet School Community,

Congratulations to the Blanchet Class of 2022! On June 11 we welcomed 46 Blanchet seniors into our alumni community with a fantastic celebration at East Salem Community Center. This was a remarkable class that shone in the classroom, in the athletic arena, on the fine arts stage, and in so many other ways.

In the end, 44 of the 46 seniors will be attending a college or university in the fall and doing so with the financial support of nearly \$5.7 million in scholarships, with 40 students earning at least one scholarship. These numbers greatly support our belief that families who invest in their child's education at Blanchet will oftentimes reap the benefits of that investment with scholarships to the colleges and universities of their child's choice.

The graduation of the class of 2022 and the promotion of our 8th grade students put a nice bow on the end of a highly successful school year for Blanchet. Back in person for the entire school year, our students relished the opportunity to take part in all of the activities, events, clubs, and other aspects that make up a Blanchet school year.

In late April we hosted our True Blue Gala, the first on-site auction since October of 2019. It was so wonderful to see nearly 300 people in attendance to help raise funds and celebrate our school.

This summer will be a busy one on our campus as we have two construction projects that are underway. The bus barn, located in the north end of the softball field, is nearly complete. This facility will also house batting cages for baseball and softball.

The other project is the new STEM wing that will bring six new classrooms to the facility. Construction began in April and is scheduled to be completed in December. We plan on being in the new classrooms for at least half of the 2022-23 school year.

Thank you for your continued support of Blanchet Catholic School. The coming years are sure to be exciting ones as we continue to grow our school and enhance our program for our families.
