IN-PERSON PROTOCOLS



In order to return students and staff to school in person this Fall, Blanchet has put together an In-Person Back 2 School Plan that we believe meets or exceeds the original requirements of both the CDC and the ODE.

Here are the details of this plan. As you read through these protocols, please keep in mind that for our in-person plan to be successful we will need full cooperation from all members of our school community.

In addition, our in-person plan will begin with an orientation period that will have our mid high students in-person two full days a week and our high school students on campus for two different days each week. This orientation period will allow our students and staff to adjust to the new protocols with a smaller number of students in the building. The length of the orientation period will be determined by the success of adjustment to the new protocols.

- Each day as they arrive for school, all students and staff would have their temperature taken using a thermal scanner in one of the two entry points - the main lobby and east end of the main gym.
- Students who register a temperature over 100.4 or show signs of illness would be moved to our isolation area in the Auxiliary Gym near the attendance office for further evaluation and to wait for a parent to pick them up.
- Students and staff would wear face coverings throughout the day in all areas except when they are eating.
- Classrooms have been adjusted to account for the 35 sq. feet per student requirement.
- In addition, we have created additional classroom spaces in our larger, common areas (Lee Student Center, Auxiliary Gym, Wiegand Auditorium, Makerspace) to accommodate classes that do not fit within the regular classrooms.
- A cleaning plan would be initiated where desks and chairs would be cleaned after each class and common areas would go through extensive cleaning protocol daily.
- Classrooms have been equipped this summer with digital recording equipment so that lessons that are taught can be recorded and uploaded for students who are not in attendance at school to watch at home.
- Parents will be instructed to keep students at home who are not feeling well for the overall benefit of our school community. By adding video capabilities to each classroom, students who are out of school will be better able to keep up with the instruction.
- Movement of students throughout the building during the day will be restricted, controlled, and monitored. For example, at the end of each period, groups would be dismissed by grade level and access to lockers would be limited to certain groups each passing time.
- Transportation will be available but students will be visually checked for illness before boarding the bus, spaced out on the bus, and masks would be worn by the driver and students at all times.
- Students will be placed in cohort groups by grade levels, for example all 9th graders would be one cohort. This will allow us to make sure if we have a student get sick that we could limit the impact it has on the rest of the school. In classes where students from multiple grades are present, the students will

sit in an area with students from their cohort group.

- If we have a positive test of COVID by a student we would be sharing that information with local county health organizations and using their guidelines to determine if we need to quarantine a group of students or have to shut down the entire school for a period of time.
- Activities such as retreats, Masses, assemblies, Tuesday Time, and BUDDIES will be adjusted to make sure we were not putting large groups together or mixing cohort groups.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) about Blanchet's In-Person Plan

If Blanchet employs this in-person protocol does my child have to attend school on campus? No. If we employ the in-person protocol, families will still have the option of distance learning from home. With the new video capabilities, students will be able to follow the lessons provided in-person while at home.

How possible will it be to get all students and staff to follow these new protocols? Although we understand that these safety protocols are different from anything we have done before, we also know that because our students and families want to be here in-person, they will be motivated to adhere to the necessary protocols. We know that students are much more able to adapt to new circumstances than adults and we are confident that once they have worked with these new realities they will quickly adjust.

What is the benefit of the cohort groups and how will that work? The main benefit of the cohort group is in the case of a positive COVID case. By limiting interactions between the groups - which will be grade levels for our school - we can better control the overall impact of a student's illness on the rest of the school. It will work by having the grade levels spend the majority of their time with students of the same grade level - this includes passing time, lunch, and other activities. When students from various cohorts are in the same class they will be seated in socially distanced groups within that classroom.

What will lunch look like in this system? Students will be allowed to eat lunch in one of the multiple areas we have set up throughout the school building. They will be seated at least 6-feet apart and sitting with members of their cohort group. Students will be encouraged to bring their own lunch from home and the only food available for sale at school will be either a box lunch (sandwich, chips, fruit, cookie, milk) or items available in one of the vending machines.

Why go to all of these adjustments to have in-person schooling? Although this protocol does include a number of adjustments that would be required, we believe that our students will greatly benefit from the normalcy of attending class in person. We believe that this will be a tremendous undertaking but a task that is well worth it for our entire school community.

How long will the Orientation period of the in-person plan last? We won't know for sure until we have a chance to work with the students and staff and the protocols for in-person. By having half of our students on campus each day, we believe that will allow us to get more comfortable with the requirements and help enhance the overall safety of the plan. The hope is that the orientation system will only last a few weeks before we resume a full-time, in-person schedule.

Will there still be bus transportation to and from school each day? Yes, when we are active in our in-person plan, bus transportation will be available in the usual manner. Students will be required to socially distance on the bus and wear face coverings for the duration of the ride. The bus driver will also wear a face covering and they will be visually checking students as they enter the bus for any signs of illness.



DIGITAL LEARNING PROTOCOLS

Blanchet’s digital learning plan is about partnering with students and families and creating an engaging learning environment. While we understand that digital learning is different in many ways than in-person instruction, we believe that, if done effectively, a digital learning plan can be a positive experience for both student and teacher. Connecting with students and having open and constant communication are keys to the success of this plan.

Our plan includes several changes from the protocols that were employed over the last three months of the 2019-2020 school year. These changes are designed to enhance the learning process for our students and to provide a more streamlined, accessible program for both families and teachers.

Here are the most significant changes to our program:

- **Increased Instruction and Structure to our digital learning days** - Our classes will meet on a regular schedule throughout the week to provide our students with a more structured approach to learning. The chart below outlines our weekly schedule. During these class periods, teachers will be providing increased instruction to our students to enhance the learning experience through video conferencing.

- **One platform for submitting assignments and tracking student work** - All of our teachers will be using Google Classroom this year to distribute assignments, collect homework, and share information such as articles, videos, and other materials with students. We believe this will be a significant improvement to last spring where various platforms were being used by teachers, making it difficult for students and parents to make sure they were tracking the right information. Google Classroom integrates with our Family Portal. Parents will be able to see grades online and have updates emailed to them with student progress.
- **Opportunities for in-person interaction on campus** - Even while our digital learning protocol is in place, Blanchet will be providing opportunities for students to experience on campus, in-person interactions through a variety of activities, including athletics, drama, clubs, counseling, and academic support. These activities are optional for students and social distancing protocols will be in place, but they will provide students a much needed opportunity to connect with classmates and enjoy activities that support their emotional, spiritual, and mental health. A final schedule of these activities is still being developed.

Blanchet's Digital Learning Weekly Class Schedule

Here are some additional details of the digital learning protocol:

- Shifting to a block schedule will allow students and teachers to focus on fewer classes each day and allow for more instruction and interaction between teacher and student.
- Each period will include students connecting with teachers through Zoom video conferencing. Although the periods are 75 minutes long, it is unlikely that students will spend the entire period on the Zoom call.
- A typical class period will include a recap of the previous lesson, new material presented by the teacher through instruction, opportunities for various activities and discussion, and an explanation of the next assignment or material to cover. Some portion of the period will likely be used for students to begin working on the next assignment.
- While students may not be on Zoom for the entire class period, teachers will remain on Zoom for the duration of the period to be available for questions or extra support.
- Attendance will be taken each period and students who are not able to attend a session are asked to notify the teacher.
- Cav Club will be the final period on Grey Days and offered on Fridays as well. These periods will be used to provide students with additional opportunities such as club meetings, tutoring, counseling, class meetings, and other activities. Students who do not have an activity or need assistance during a Cav Club period are not required to be in attendance.
- Co-curricular activities, including sports, drama, clubs, and other activities, will be offered each afternoon. Activities will be available for both MH and HS students. A schedule of these offerings is being developed and will be shared at a later date. These activities are available to students but not required.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) about Blanchet's Digital Learning Protocol

Why Google Classroom? We chose to shift to Google Classroom because it is the platform that the majority of our students are most comfortable with from previous experience and it offers the best connection to our Student Information System that houses our grades.

Are there any changes with the use of our Zoom program? Yes, we have chosen to upgrade our Zoom accounts to provide more functionality and a better video conferencing experience for our students and teachers. The new account will allow for breakout sessions within the Zoom call and enhanced security measures as well.

What happens if I'm absent from a Zoom class? While attendance is expected at all of your classes, we understand that students will not be able to attend every session. It will be important for the student (and family) to let the teacher know of their absence and for the student to follow the posted Zoom videos and assignments.

My student struggled with digital learning last spring, how will this be different? We know that for some students the digital learning process is more of a challenge. By offering additional opportunities for students to get tutoring and academic support from teachers we believe we can help them stay on track. Teachers will have posted office hours where they are available to offer support and we will be establishing homework study tables - both digitally and in-person to provide additional support.

How are we allowed to offer in-person opportunities for students but we are not allowed to be in school full-time in-person? That's a great question and I don't really have a good answer for that. I do know that the latest guidelines and rules (which seem to change each week) do allow for some in-person opportunities even when we are employing our digital learning protocol. We know how important these in-person opportunities are for our students so we will be working to provide them whenever and however possible.

Some of my teachers last spring didn't use Zoom or Google Classroom, how ready will they be to employ these programs if we employ our digital learning protocol? The summer has provided our teachers and staff with additional time to get more comfortable with both of these programs and to plan for the possibility of digital learning. Teachers are going through training on both programs during the summer to make sure we are ready if our digital plan is employed.

Public schools have already committed to online learning for a minimum period of time - either 9 weeks or 18 weeks. If Blanchet employs their digital plan will they do the same? No. Because of our size and ability to adapt quickly, Blanchet would be able to shift into and out of our digital learning protocol much quicker than public schools. This was the case last March where Blanchet began our digital learning program immediately after schools were closed while the public schools didn't begin any process for more than five weeks.

What about grades? Will we still receive letter grades and should we expect to have more assessments than we did in the spring? Yes, as they did last spring, Blanchet students will receive letter grades for their academic efforts. Assessment is another area that our teachers will be working on for our new digital protocols and students should expect more and varied assessment experiences.

Why are there no classes scheduled for Fridays? We believe that the format we have set up will provide students with an appropriate amount of learning opportunities throughout the week. For the teachers we expect Fridays to provide a chance to hold office hours, prep for the upcoming week, correct student work, and offer assistance through email or meetings. For the students, Fridays will provide much needed time to complete assignments, work on long-term projects, and take part in the various Cav Club and co-curricular offerings.

Will families be able to check out devices to help support digital learning at home? Yes, just as we did in the spring, Blanchet will have some devices for families to use to support digital learning at home.

Do you expect changes to these digital learning protocols during the year? Yes, one thing we have come to expect is that all things are subject to change based on the latest news, guidelines, and expectations established by local and state government related to COVID-19. I know this is challenging for our families and staff but, for now, that is our reality. We believe that constant communication can be helpful in making the best of these ever-changing times.

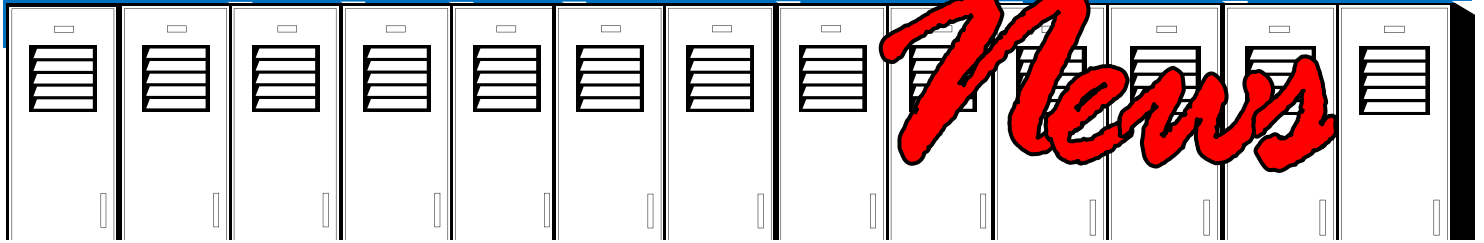
The digital plan calls for block scheduling, when we are in-person will that continue? No, when we are in-person we will return to a 7-period schedule with 0 period coming before 1st period.

NEW FACTS FINANCIAL RESOURCES



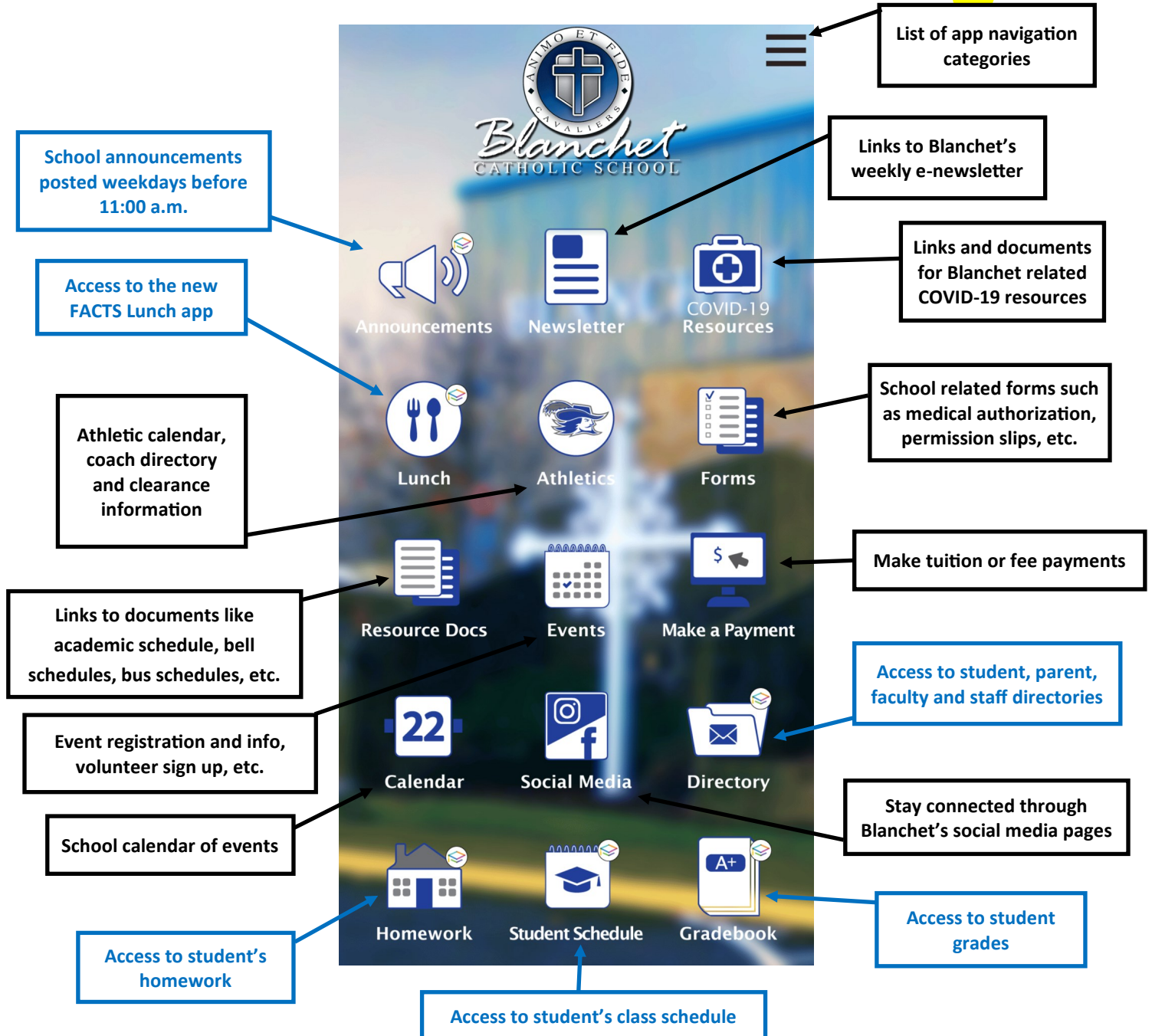

All students must be in compliance with the Blanchet dress code at New Student Orientation on Sept. 3.

- Boys must wear collared shirts. *While girls do not have to wear collared shirts, they may not wear t-shirts or otherwise inappropriate tops.* The shirts may be any color or pattern. Turtleneck shirts may be worn. Mock turtlenecks are not allowed.
- Neckline must be no lower than 2 inches from the top of the collarbone.

Pants must be clean, hemmed, fitted and worn on the hips. Excessively long, excessively loose or excessively tight pants are not acceptable.
- Denim pants, shorts or skirts are not acceptable. Athletic shorts and sweats are also not acceptable.
- Shorts must be worn with the bottom of the hem no more than 3 inches above the knee.
- Skirts must be worn with the bottom of the hem no higher than the top of the knee. This includes the top of slits on skirts.
- Only girls may wear earrings. No other visible piercing is allowed.
- Hair must be clean, neatly combed and of a natural color. Hair for boys must not extend below the collar and sideburns must not extend below the earlobe.
- No open-toed or backless shoes. High heels can be no taller than three inches.

I hope everyone in your family is healthy and safe in this challenging time of our lives. As I am sure you are all aware, the OSAA has informed us that Winter/Fall/Spring sports will now take place January through June.

Concussion – Private School Informed Consent

Excerpt OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies, Concussion Management

(Revised Fall 2015)

A. **Member School’s Responsibilities (Max’s Law, ORS 336.485, OAR 581-022-0421) (Jenna’s Law, ORS 417.875)**

- 1) **Suspected or Diagnosed Concussion.** Any athlete who exhibits signs, symptoms or behaviors consistent with a concussion following an observed or suspected blow to the head or body, or who has been diagnosed with a concussion, shall not be permitted to return to that athletic contest or practice, or any other athletic contest or practice on that same day. In schools which have the services of an athletic trainer registered by the Oregon Board of Athletic Trainers, that athletic trainer may determine that an athlete has not exhibited signs, symptoms or behaviors consistent with a concussion, and has not suffered a concussion, and return the athlete to play. Athletic trainers may also work in consultation with an appropriate Health Care Professional (see below) in determining when an athlete is able to return to play following a concussion.
- 2) **Return to Participation.** Until an athlete who has suffered a concussion is no longer experiencing signs, symptoms, or behaviors consistent with a concussion, and a medical release form signed by an appropriate Health Care Professional (Physician (MD), Physician’s Assistant (PA), Doctor of Osteopathic (DO) licensed by the Oregon State Board of Medicine, nurse practitioner licensed by the Oregon State Board of Nursing, or Psychologist licensed by the Oregon Board of Psychologist Examiners) is obtained, the athlete shall not be permitted to return to athletic activity.
- 3) **Private Schools Only.**

On an annual basis prior to participation, private schools shall require each student and at least one parent or legal guardian of the student to sign the Concussion – Private School Informed Consent form acknowledging the receipt of information regarding symptoms and warning signs of concussions. Private schools shall maintain a copy of each student’s signed form on file for review at any time by OSAA staff.

HEADS+UP CONCUSSION IN HIGH SCHOOL SPORTS

A FACT SHEET FOR PARENTS

What is a concussion?

A concussion is a brain injury. Concussions are caused by a bump, blow, or jolt to the head or body. Even a “ding,” “getting your bell rung,” or what seems to be a mild bump or blow to the head can be serious.

What are the signs and symptoms?

You can't see a concussion. Signs and symptoms of concussion can show up right after the injury or may not appear or be noticed until days after the injury. If your teen reports **one or more** symptoms of concussion listed below, or if you notice the symptoms yourself, keep your teen out of play and seek medical attention right away.

Signs Observed by Parents or Guardians	Symptoms Reported by Athlete
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Appears dazed or stunned • Is confused about assignment or position • Forgets an instruction • Is unsure of game, score, or opponent • Moves clumsily • Answers questions slowly • Loses consciousness (even briefly) • Shows mood, behavior, or personality changes • Can't recall events prior to hit or fall • Can't recall events after hit or fall 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Headache or “pressure” in head • Nausea or vomiting • Balance problems or dizziness • Double or blurry vision • Sensitivity to light or noise • Feeling sluggish, hazy, foggy, or groggy • Concentration or memory problems • Confusion • Just not “feeling right” or is “feeling down”

How can you help your teen prevent a concussion?

Every sport is different, but there are steps your teens can take to protect themselves from concussion and other injuries.

- Make sure they wear the right protective equipment for their activity. It should fit properly, be well maintained, and be worn consistently and correctly.

- Ensure that they follow their coaches' rules for safety and the rules of the sport.
- Encourage them to practice good sportsmanship at all times.

What should you do if you think your teen has a concussion?

- 1. Keep your teen out of play.** If your teen has a concussion, her/his brain needs time to heal. Don't let your teen return to play the day of the injury and until a health care professional, experienced in evaluating for concussion, says your teen is symptom-free and it's OK to return to play. A repeat concussion that occurs before the brain recovers from the first—usually within a short period of time (hours, days, or weeks)—can slow recovery or increase the likelihood of having long-term problems. In rare cases, repeat concussions can result in edema (brain swelling), permanent brain damage, and even death.
- 2. Seek medical attention right away.** A health care professional experienced in evaluating for concussion will be able to decide how serious the concussion is and when it is safe for your teen to return to sports.
- 3. Teach your teen that it's not smart to play with a concussion.** Rest is key after a concussion. Sometimes athletes wrongly believe that it shows strength and courage to play injured. Discourage others from pressuring injured athletes to play. Don't let your teen convince you that s/he's “just fine.”
- 4. Tell all of your teen's coaches and the student's school nurse about ANY concussion.** Coaches, school nurses, and other school staff should know if your teen has ever had a concussion. Your teen may need to limit activities while s/he is recovering from a concussion. Things such as studying, driving, working on a computer, playing video games, or exercising may cause concussion symptoms to reappear or get worse. Talk to your health care professional, as well as your teen's coaches, school nurse, and teachers. If needed, they can help adjust your teen's school activities during her/his recovery.

If you think your teen has a concussion:

Don't assess it yourself. Take him/her out of play. Seek the advice of a health care professional.

It's better to miss one game than the whole season.
