ABSENCE: If your student will be late to school or absent for the entire day, please notify the attendance office prior to 8:35 a.m. each day of their absence/tardiness.

APPOINTMENTS: Please notify the attendance office at least one day prior to the appointment if your student must check out during school hours. It is a disruption to the classroom when students must be called out of class without prior notification.



TRANSPORTATION

Blanchet is able to offer bus transportation both before and after school. Buses will pick up and drop off students in the parking lot of the four Salem Catholic churches and elsewhere at the following approximate times.

Students are asked to be at the pick up locations five minutes prior to these departure times.

- Queen of Peace and St. Joseph bus departs Blanchet at 3:20 p.m.
- St. Vincent de Paul and St. Edward bus departs Blanchet at 3:30 p.m.

Students must be picked up within 15 minutes in the afternoon.

* **St. Joseph** bus stops on the *Chemeketa Street* side of the church after school on regular school days. It stops on the Center Street side in the mornings and after school on half days.

** St. Luke & Sacred Heart bus riders... Blanchet will offer morning transportation for families who are coming from the Woodburn/Gervais area. This is only a morning transportation opportunity as there will not be an afternoon run of this route. A Blanchet employee will make two stops on this route beginning with St. Luke's Catholic School in Woodburn each school day. After picking up the Blanchet students at St. Luke's, the bus will stop at Sacred Heart Catholic School in Gervais to pick up students before heading to the Blanchet campus. In order to ensure that we provide a large enough vehicle for the number of students who are planning on participating in this route on a daily basis, we need families to reserve a spot for this route by emailing us at attendance@blanchetcatholicschool.com by August 31, 2022.

Boys must wear collared shirts. While girls do not have to wear collared shirts, they may not wear t-shirts or otherwise inappropriate tops. The shirts may be any color or pattern. Turtleneck shirts may be worn. Mock turtlenecks are not allowed

Neckline must be no lower than 2 inches from the top of the collarbone.

Pants must be clean, hemmed, fitted and worn on the hips. Excessively long, excessively loose or excessively tight pants are not acceptable.

Denim pants, shorts or skirts are not acceptable. Athletic shorts and sweats are also not acceptable.

- Shorts must be worn with the bottom of the hem \checkmark no more than 3 inches above the knee.
- Skirts must be worn with the bottom of the \checkmark hem no higher than the top of the knee. This includes the top of slits on skirts.



Only girls may wear earrings. No other visible piercing is allowed.

Hair must be clean, neatly combed and of a natural color. Hair for boys must not extend below the collar and sideburns must not extend below the earlobe.

CONSTRUCTION ON CAMPUS

Construction of our new STEM wing is underway. The new facility is located on the East side of campus. Construction vehicles enter campus from the Sunnyview Rd. entrance, East parking lot by the Science Center and through the main entrance. Please use caution as you enter and exit campus. The construction area is fenced and we ask that students stay away from the active construction site while on campus.

Construction of our new STEM wing began this past spring. We plan to be in the STEM wing by the start of second semester. The new state-of-the-art facility will include six classrooms/labs for use by both mid high and high school students.

The funding for this project has been generously supported by a few of Blanchet's long-time donors who see the significant value in further developing our campus facility and supporting programs related to STEM. Additional funds will be raised to furbish the new classrooms and support the programs in the new facility.



DROP OFF & PICK UP

Blanchet has two entrances on to campus—Market Street Entrance (main entrance) and Sunnyview Road Entrance (back entrance). Traffic flow on campus can get congested at times, especially in the front of the building. A couple of ways to help alleviate this problem is to:

- Pull all the way up to the curbside as close to the car in front of you.
- Have your student(s) ready to exit your vehicle.
- *Market Street Entrance*: Front car in the line can pull all the way forward until they are in front of the white cross. Waiting to drop off until you get closer to the front of the line, it should help make sure the backup doesn't extend all the way back to Market Street at our busiest times.
- Sunnyview Rd. Entrance: Students can enter through any of the Mid High Commons doors using their ID cards.

In addition, please make sure to drive slowly while on campus. We have students all over the campus coming and going from various activities, practices and games. We greatly appreciate your help in this matter.
